"Demystifying EPR-A Key Enabler for Circular Economy" is a webinar series that intends to create awareness on India's current position, key challenges and explore innovative solutions on EPR with the hope of synchronizing Industry-Government efforts to enable a circular economy. The focus is to highlight ground realities w.r.t compliance and decode the impact of latest amendments in the rules.
